



WHAT CAN I DO?

Prevention is the key — the simplest and most effective solution is to commit to not text message while driving.

- * Finish using your cell phone completely before you begin your drive.
- * When you power up your car, power down your phone.
- * When you arrive, turn your phone back on and text as much as you like.
- * If you feel that you must check or respond to a text message immediately, pull off the road and safely stop the car first.
